

## Cancer

Cancer has come into your life and you are (pick one or more of the following):

You are not alone. Millions have gone before you. Some have cancer; with others cancer may have attacked a family member or a friend. Whether you are a patient, a caregiver, or a member of the support team, help is available. On this web site we have published two documents. The first is “**We Heard the Wings of Angels.**” It is a collection of 32 devotions for cancer patients and their families. Cancer patients and their families wrote the devotions. They were compiled and edited by Judy and Herb Nordmeyer.
